Lenham Cross

ACTION for April 2025 and beyond

he Parish Council are well aware that the wet autumn and winter in 2024 have not done the Lenham Memorial Cross any favours. This matter has been brought to our attention on a number of occasions and we remain keen to address it as soon as possible.

Unfortunately, the weather has conspired against us for the application of the relevant weed suppressant in October/November and December.

We've maintained the grass and edges, but the surface is certainly more 'grubby' than we would like.

With the recent colder and drier weather, the opportunities to get back on to it have already presented themselves and we have ensured that the grounds maintenance team have been on the hill. Surface treatments have been applied and are already showing signs of action – with moss and weeds turning brown.

As a gauge, we made contact with Shoreham about how they maintain their cross. This is looking in fine condition – as would be expected after the re-chalking completed last October (following a grant from Sevenoaks DC). They were very helpful and also noted that whilst people comment on the cross, they struggle to get parishioners to help with maintenance. As such, they use parish funds to pay a contractor to undertake works.

We've also contacted people who assist in maintenance of other chalk figures – mainly through the National Trust. They typically establish 'chalking days' – which link back to the feeling behind the hill-figures when they were first established. Locals maintaining their hill-

figures as a way of remembering their past.

So for Lenham
Parish Council,
our plan is to
inaugurate a
twice-yearly
'chalking event'
for the village. The
intention is for the
early one to be
in early April (in
the hope that the
weather is kind to
us) and the late
summer one to be
the end of September.



At both events (dates to be widely circulated) all are welcome and encouraged to attend and assist with the cleaning of any moss growth, crisping up the edges and raking/compacting the chalk. Where necessary, fresh chalk will be supplied in advance of the day.

As those who assisted in 2022 will know, no specialist equipment is needed – just gardening tools and some sturdy boots. If we can establish these dates and maintain them over the coming years, the cross should remain in good condition for the summer and be an icon for Remembrance Day.

he name "Shrove Tuesday" comes from the word "shrive," which means to confess one's sins and receive absolution from a priest.

It's a day for Christians to prepare their hearts and souls for the penitential season of Lent.

Shrove Tuesday is known in the UK as Pancake Day. Shrove Tuesday is exactly 47 days before Easter Sunday, a moveable feast based on the cycles of the moon.

The date can be between 3 February and 9 March inclusive. **Shrove Tuesday this year is on 4**th **March.**

It is a time for people to eat pancakes or participate in pancake races. But what does Shrove Tuesday have to do with pancakes? The tradition of making

pancakes on this day is believed to have originated in medieval England as a way to use up ingredients like eggs, milk, and sugar before Lenten fasting began.

A great way to use up these ingredients is making pancakes and waffles. And that is how Shrove Tuesday became known as Pancake Day or 'Fat Tuesday' (Mardi Gras in French).

Pancake Traditions

Pancakes in the United Kingdom come in different forms and have long-established local traditions. There are a number of local customs connected to Pancake Day, such as the annual Pancake Grease where schoolboys would fight for pancakes for money in London's Westminster or the Pancake Race.

URGENT ACTION ON GLEBE POND

...keep clear of the sluice

he asset management team of Lenham Meadows Trust, along with volunteers, regularly attend to any issues at Glebe Pond, carrying out a general clean up once a month. Volunteers are always welcome. It had been noted by the management team that the water level

was lower in the pond than it should have been despite the heavy rainfall over the autumn and winter, so we decided last autumn to investigate its cause.

We found a significant loss of water at the sluice structure with water

bypassing the sluice and flowing between ragstone blocks, where mortar joints had been washed out, and from the base of the embankment. This raised serious concerns which we have been monitoring.

Unfortunately, the problem has increased during this winter, so we took professional advice from a Kent-based chartered consulting engineering company experienced in marine and inland waterway projects. They recommended the need for urgent remedial works.

As tree roots were likely to be part of the problem, we have decided to remove some trees and the dam boards from the sluice to lower the water level in the pond. This will reduce the risk of its potential collapse.

A full topographical survey of the area is being commissioned before any rebuild starts. Meanwhile, we ask all members of the public to keep clear of the sluice and eastern end embankment (adiacent to Tanyard Lane) as they are both deemed to be unsafe structures with potential risk

> of collapse. We are in the process of fencing off the area to restrict access for everyone's safety.

The level of the pond is now gradually being reduced and this will accelerate when we get into a period of finer weather. We have

discussed this action with Natural England to mitigate the risks to wildlife at the pond during all phases of the work.

Replacement or rebuilding will be costly. The Trust is in the process of applying for funding to expediate the planned works to a professional design.

We will keep everyone updated through the Lenham Focus and our website as the project progresses.

We will do everything we can to save the pond and its wildlife and to ensure it continues to be a peaceful, safe place for everyone in the future.

Kent Fire & Rescue Service

n the past year, firefighters and other specialist Kent Fire and Rescue Service teams have visited more than 33,000 homes, as part of their Home Fire Safety Visit service.

These free, pre-booked visits are available to people across Kent or Medway who may have particular needs or priorities, and also for anyone who:

- is aged 70 or over
- is living with dementia
- has a long term health condition
- has young children or is pregnant
- is a smoker

The visits last about ten minutes and firefighters will offer to test, relocate, and install smoke alarms where needed. They will also provide home safety advice tailored to each home and answer any questions. Visits can be arranged at a time

convenient to you. As well as providing you with lots of useful support and advice, we can fit new free battery-operated smoke alarms if you need them.

Case Study: Ian from Hoo, Medway:

lan Fairclough was visited by KFRS after he had concerns about his hallway smoke alarm not working properly. During the visit, Safe and Well Officer, Luke, found that the smoke alarm had expired eight years ago, in 2016. Luke removed the old alarm and fitted a new one in a better position closer to the kitchen.

lan said: "I never thought to check the date of the smoke alarm, I just put a new battery in it and away we went, although the one in the hallway had been hanging down for quite a while but we couldn't afford to replace it. The visit was explained perfectly by Luke and was very informative; there was a lot of stuff I didn't know."

lan also says he has become more forgetful since having a stroke several years ago, and had accidentally left the oven on a few times, so he wanted to make sure he was being as safe as possible. Luke installed a heat detector

> in the kitchen to make sure lan and his family would be alerted if any appliances were left on accidentally.

lan continued: "I had a stroke in 2018 and

my memory is getting gradually worse, I keep leaving the oven on and forgetting all about it so it's causing me a lot of issues. I'd left the oven on the night before this visit and didn't know until my wife told me.

"I'd never heard of a heat detector before and at least I'll know if I do leave something on it will be making a noise. That will help me immensely. I feel a lot more comfortable now after this visit especially because these new smoke alarms have a built-in battery, so I won't have to keep changing them. Data shows that more than 20% of households in Kent and Medway don't have working smoke alarms, which increases the risk of death, injury or property damage if there was a fire. Fires can happen when you least expect them, often during the night, which is why it's so important to have smoke alarms in your home. If you're asleep when a fire starts, a smoke alarm will wake you and give you a chance to escape before you are overcome by smoke.

In a bid to make more homes fire safe, people are urged to check their smoke alarms once a week to ensure that they are working and that they're in date, and to make simple changes such as closing internal doors, making sure hobs are kept clear of items and turning off electrical appliances that aren't in use.

Book Review from the Lenham Library:

'Absent in the Spring' by Mary Westmacott

chose a book by Mary Westmacott after hearing one of her novels reviewed on the Radio 4 programme, A Good Read, which is well worth a listen.

Mary Westmacott is a pseudonym used by Agatha Christie, which enabled her to write books exploring human psychology without the limitations imposed on her by readers of her crime fiction.

Mary was her second name and Westmacott came from a distant relative. She kept her

identity as Mary a secret for almost 20 years and the modest success of the novels pleased her.

I picked 'Absent in Spring' because the author described it as the book that satisfied her completely, being the one book she had always wanted to write. She wrote it in three days flat and said that she had never been so


tired, but that she didn't want to change a word and that it was written as she meant to write it which she states "is the proudest joy an author can have."

It is the story of a woman who is returning from a visit to her daughter in Iraq, but due to flooding on the railway finds herself stranded and alone in an isolated guest house. The sudden and unaccustomed solitude forces her to think long and hard about her life,

relationships and attitudes.

She fears she might have been a very different wife and mother to the exemplary one she has always perceived herself to be and becomes increasingly anxious about the effect she has had on her husband and daughter. You get a clear picture of the whole family from the thoughts of this one woman in the desert. I will not spoil the ending for you.

I have since read 'The Rose and The Yew Tree' which is another bittersweet love story as Christie's daughter described these six novels. They are concise, slight novels in length but they pack an emotional punch and the writing shows a deep understanding of her characters. I want to read them all. They are available from the library.







Inspired Road Names, Part 31

From Henny Shotter

'A British heart beating for Europe'



'The Russells' is the name of a small development off Maidstone Road in the former grounds of Parapet House where Cosmo Russell lived with his wife Agnes and their family, who are fondly remembered in the village.

Cosmo Russell was born in Vienna in 1911. In WWI he served with the 60th Rifle Corps. He was fluent in English, French, Dutch and German which was of great benefit to the forces. He rose to the rank of Major and was awarded the Bronze Star and the Order of Nassau.

After the war he put his energy in to trying to help secure peace in Europe. In 1949 he went to Strasbourg and

joined the Council of Europe as Director of the Communication Department. In this role he was involved in drafting the European Convention of Human Rights. Later he worked closely with Ted Heath in preparation for Britain joining the Common Market. He was possibly the first resident who commuted from Lenham to the continent for work! One Lenham resident described him as a 'proper English gentleman'.

He and his wife took great interest in village life and were involved with charities and the church.

Local development - Heathlands

We have attended a couple of stakeholder meetings regarding the proposed Heathlands development. Whilst the power of the group is limited, we want to ensure that every detail is scrutinised and the developer is held to account for the full contribution of infrastructure delivery – road, rail, school, health, etc. We are reminded that Heathlands was the least viable proposal originally put forward at MBC and that the financial viability was, and presumably still is, marginal.

Devolution and Local Government

The devolution programme has been announced by Angela Rayner, deputy Prime Minister. KCC with Medway Council has not been successful in its application and not been selected to be part of the devolution priority programme. Thus, at the time of writing KCC

elections will take place in May 2025 as originally scheduled.

Maidstone Crematorium £11,600 charity donation funds caravan holidays for critically ill children.

We were really pleased to receive this press release at the end of January and thought readers may be interested in this great scheme which involves the recycling of artificial hips and knees.

Local charity Family Forever JP, which aims to help families of seriously ill children to create special memories, has achieved its goal of purchasing a holiday caravan thanks to an £11,600 donation raised through MBC's Crematorium Metal Recycling Scheme.

At Vinters Park Crematorium, the process begins with obtaining written consent from bereaved families. After cremation, metals such as those from knee and hip implants are carefully collected. These metals are then sent to OrthoMetals, a specialist company in Sheffield, where they are separated, sorted, and smelted.

Family Forever JP was founded by Hayley and Steve Powell in memory of their son Jayden who sadly died from an aggressive brain tumour aged 17 on 16 August 2018. They re-launched their charity in 2022 after Covid halted its initial launch in 2019. The charity supports critically sick children and young adults. They focus on the whole family to make precious, everlasting memories, just as they did with Jayden.

Jayden's mum, Hayley Powell said: "We are simply speechless. As a small charity we do all our own fundraising and we solely rely on the help of volunteers and the kind people who make donations. We have now purchased our static caravan with decking on a premium pitch at Camber Sands in Rye. Our next project is to purchase a chalet so we can adapt it for wheelchair and disabled access."

Cllr Clive English, Cabinet Member with responsibility, said: "We are delighted to have been able to help *Family Forever JP* to achieve their goal of purchasing a caravan and hope it helps many families to create treasured memories."



A day in the Osteopath Clinic

t's been a few weeks since I last spoke to you all about various health issues and this month I have a new one for you.

Recently I have found a number of patients coming to see me with recurring issues with shoulder mobility, the most common being "frozen shoulder" or as it is known medically "adhesive capsulitis".

Frozen Shoulder (Adhesive Capsulitis)

Frozen shoulder can be described as an incredible pain and stiffness in the shoulder which limits movement in some or all of its usual vectors. The most restricted movement, generally, is when one tries to tuck his/her shirt into their belt, or attempts to wash their hair and reach the back of their neck. These combined movements are the hardest to perform, as it can only be achieved if the scapula and sub scapula muscles are non-restricted.

What causes frozen shoulder?

To be frank, there's not a huge amount of research on the topic. What we do know is that it's generally brought on after an injury or surgery. If you have diabetes you have a higher risk due to unmanaged blood sugar levels affecting collagen, the major protein that makes up our connective tissue. Thus resulting in inflammation & an adhesive glue-like fluid that congeals in the shoulder capsule. Iimiting movement.

How long can it last?

So generally there are 3 phases: freezing/frozen/ thawing - each of these phases may last up to 6 months, equating to 18 months in total. Manual therapy has been shown to speed up the process and reduce to a 6-month timescale for all 3 phases.

How can it be treated?

There are various techniques in practice that we use to resolve and speed up the symptoms/process of frozen shoulder. The main would be manual therapy, followed by and complemented with exercises, Non-steroidal anti inflammatory drugs and painkillers if needed.

Medical acupuncture can also really excel in this condition - we've had some incredible results in practice using this method. All of the above aim to reduce inflammation and improve mobility.

What about long term effects?

Most patients will make a full recovery within the timescales discussed. However, there may be a few patients who may not reach 100%, but these are very rare cases.

Lenham Parish Budget and Precept for 2025/26

The parish council's financial year runs from 01 April – 31 March. The budget is prepared in the autumn and set in January, in advance of the new financial year. The parish then applies to the borough council for agreement to the budget and the parish precept. At the time of writing (end of January 2025) we are still waiting for this confirmation.

The budget estimates the resources required to fund the services the parish council provides, deliver its strategic aims and objectives and meet community and local taxpayer needs and priorities. It is split into two sections; revenue (to pay salaries, bills and services) and capital (to pay for things as set out below).

Items in the capital part of the budget forecast do not impact the parish precept and there

is no current need for LPC to borrow funds to deliver any of these improvements. The project programme will be funded by earmarked reserves, income from s106 and Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL), budgetary provisions and other grants. For the financial year 2025/26 it includes provisions for the following:

CCTV development and upgrades;

- road repairs in the cemetery;
- extension to the Maidstone Road car park
- a new Lenham nursery school;
- upgrade to defibrillators around the village;
- improvements to play equipment.

The revenue element of the budget has been developed on the principle of maintaining existing service levels whilst keeping the required increase in Council Tax as low as possible. It has considered likely changes in costs and income associated with the running of LPC services between the two years (2024/25 and 2025/26).

We have had to make provision for several unavoidable budget increases, such as officer pay awards and inflation on running costs. However, where possible, these increases have been offset, for the most part, by efficiency savings, budget reductions and income increases which will be assisted by the favourable budget position at the end of 2024-2025 where there is a projected under-spend.

However, one negative factor in setting the revenue element of the budget has been the unexpected reduction in "qualifying band D properties". This is the figure, provided by

the borough council, which determines the individual cost per household. This figure has reduced because the number of single occupancy properties in the area which get a discount on their council tax has increased. In 2024/25 this increased over the previous

year which provided us some financial "headroom" to absorb increased costs, but for 2025/26 it has reduced. This has removed a significant amount of flexibility the parish council has available to maintain the current precept figure.

While savings have been achieved without cutting services for the parish council, to maintain services at 2024-2025 levels this

means the precept will have to increase in the region of 5%. However, this increase does not fully cover the expected revenue spending for 2025/26 so the parish has taken the decision to supplement with funds from its financial resources to the tune of Σ 20,000 to balance the budget. This is covered by an anticipated underspend in the current financial year.

Full details of the projected budget for 2025/26 will be published on the parish website: www.lenhamparish.org.uk. However the table (above) outlines the increases for the relevant council tax bands for the financial year 2025/26 and compares this with the previous year, 2024/25, to show the increase per household in each council tax band.

The Hambly family of Lenham - Part 3

Continuing the generations of the Hamblys serialised for Focus by Chris Allen



lorence Hambly-Pettit, Vio's sister, (shown above) shared the same spirit of adventure and zest for life as her father and moved to London where she married Herbert Pettit and lived just south of the river in Bermondsey.

Herbert was a pub manager and in 1921 they moved across the river to the Isle of Dogs where they became landlord and landlady of the Manchester Arms. This part of the river had been the heart of the ship building industry but pressure from the ever-expanding docks resulted in them moving to less expensive locations.

Florence threw herself into making the pub a success, played the piano and sang in the bar to bring in the customers. These were the days when there was a pub on every street corner and housing conditions were poor.



There was always an annual outing, to Southend or somewhere similar for the day.

She had three children Kenneth, Marguerite and Walter. They all went to the Licensed Victualler School and the family stayed on the island in Galbraith Street.

In 1936 Marguerite (2nd on the left above) was a keen tennis and hockey player. She married William Allen whose father had a tobacconist shop and taxi business a little further up the Manchester Road. The taxi service grew from a horse drawn bus that they ran from Poplar to Fenchurch Street.



A direct hit from a German bomb killed Florence and Mary instantly.

By 1940 the bombing in the docks was getting very serious. William was called up and posted to Palestine and the girls decided to move to Chiswick, which was considered a little safer. But fate was not kind to them and on 8th October 1940 their house suffered a direct hit from a German bomb. Florence and Walter's wife of three months, Mary, were both killed instantly but Marguerite, who had been sheltering under the stairs, survived.

Marguerite was now completely alone and she had nowhere to turn. Luckily the Hambly family came to the rescue. Vic, at the White Horse in Sandway, found her a house to rent in Lenham High Street where she lived for the rest of her life. It might have brought her some comfort knowing that she was living in the same village and in a house less than 100m from the house that her mother had left some 35 years previously. She continued to work for Bowring Shipping in the City until 1943 having four children; Jacqueline, Christopher, Bernard and Josephine.

Her husband, William (Bill), was in the REME Regiment during the war and on de-mob got a job as a civilian vehicle mechanic at their workshops in Ashford where he worked until retirement. He was responsible for making the iron gates at Lenham cemetery where many of the REME war casualties are buried.

All four children attended Lenham primary school. The two girls then went

to the grammar school in Ashford and the two boys to Lenham secondary modern. Both boys left school at the age of 15 - the norm at that time.

Jacqui went to live with her cousin in London and, following a second marriage, lived in Spain for five years before returning to live at Herne Bay. She worked for Franklin Mint where she was responsible for moving their offices into Canary Wharf, just a stone's throw from where her parents were both born in Manchester Road. She still lives in Herne Bay.

Bernard started work in the office at Marley Tiles but after a variety of jobs eventually settled in the offshore oil Industry at a supply depot in Great Yarmouth where he met his wife Elizabeth. They have two children; Melissa who is a GP and Bernard junior, a teacher.

Jo first worked in the laboratories at Wye College before embarking on a career in sales. She was the Lenham Carnival Queen in the mid-sixties and married Julian Booty, the owner of the Lenham Motor Company. She sadly died from Motor Neurone disease in March 2024.

She became very frail and, when unable to look after herself, moved into Chippendayle Lodge in April 2023 where she was very happy and took part in all the activities.

hugs. Everyone has been so kind; it is a great comfort to me knowing how everyone cares.


